Fr. Tolton—The Story Goes On... "God's Plans Are Not Our Plans"

What a thrill for the devout Catholic, ex-slave, former cigar-maker and soda-bottler from Quincy, Illinois, to see the great dome of St. Peter's! On March 12, 1880, Augustus Tolton arrived at the three-story building with the inscription: Collegium Urbanum de Propaganda Fide. His education in Rome would last six years. Two years completing college work, mostly philosophy, then four years of theological studies.

Early in 1886, Augustus learned that he would be ordained a priest on Holy Saturday, April 24, in St. John Lateran Church, "The Mother Church of Rome and the World". That was a high honor. But the surprise came on Good Friday, the day before ordination, when Cardinal Simeoni reminded Augustus of the oath he made upon his arrival the Propaganda: he would go anywhere in the world he was sent. The Cardinal informed Deacon Tolton that instead of being sent to Africa, the continent Augustus had spent many a free moment studying over the past 6-years, God had other plans. Simeoni announced, "America has been called the most enlightened nation in the world. We shall see whether it deserves that honor. If the United States has never before seen a black priest, it must see one now." Father Augustus Tolton was returning to his hometown, Quincy, Illinois, in the Diocese of Alton.
